Now, I can make myself a cup of tea in our real kitchen, and work in our lovely lounge on a comfy couch with proper tables, lights etc. I feel inspired working in that room!

There are truly no words adequate to describe the gratitude that I have for you, the outstanding team of volunteers and people in the community who contributed to this renovation. You have no idea the capacity of the lives that are touched in a positive way because of your selfless, generous acts of community giving.
